

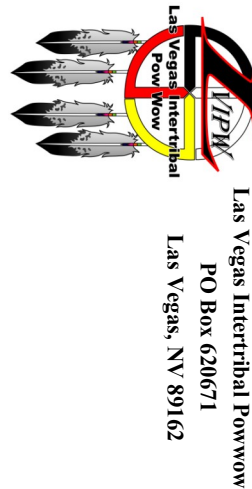
## We have a dream for the Las Vegas Intertribal Community

**Warrior's Medal of Valor**

*The Warrior's Medal of Valor is the first medal ever minted for the Native Americans Nations to honor all military personnel, active duty, reservist, National Guard and Veterans.*

*The Warrior's Medal of Valor has been presented to veterans and active duty personnel at various Native American events, regardless of the recipient's cultural*

*background.*

*The originator of this medal, Marshall Tall Eagle Serna is a US Army and US Air Force veteran, who spent a total of 14 years in the military. He is a Vietnam veteran, who saw the vision of honoring our veterans with a medal of honor from all the First Nations people of North America.*
